- Step 1. Start Internet Explorer
- Step 2. The Reference Desk is at www.refdesk.com
- Step 3. Do Not print this Page [The Favorites List]
You will only hear sound if headphones are attached.
- Step 4. The Page Setup - **Print page as described**
- Step 5. The Help Command - **Do Not print this page.**

Stop here. No need to do steps 6 and 7

Hands-On Exercise 2: Searching the Web (pp.846 – 850), 4 pts.

- Step 1. Search Google using the search string Apollo 11 Image Gallery
- Step 2. Save full sized image to USB:\cs103\web
- Step 3. Insert the Picture you saved previously [Multitasking]
- Step 4. Move and Size the Picture.
- Step 5. Insert a footnote - **Print this Document.**
No need to do steps 6 and 7

Hands-On Exercise 3: Shopping in Cyberspace (pp. 858 – 864), 4 pts.

- [] Step 1. Visit Barnes and Noble Website
 - [] Step 2. Click the Favorites button and then the Organize button within bar.
 - [] Step 3. Search for a Book
 - [] Step 4. Check Out Now – You will not actually check out so don't submit.
 - [] Step 5. Add two other web sites to the E-Commerce folder in favorites
 - [] Step 6. Return to a Favorite
 - [] Step 7. The History List Print this document
 1. Select IE Click History Toolbar button to Open History Pane
 2. Capture IE window using Alt-PrintScreen.
 3. Open Word and create a new document
 4. Create a centered title called *The Surfing History for your name*
 5. Save the file as MyHistory.doc in the USB:\cs103\web folder
 6. Print this document
